

Head and Neck Cancer Management

The University of the West of England invites you to take part in this advanced and challenging module on the management of head and neck cancer. This multidisciplinary course is for all health professionals working within head and neck cancer.

The module will run from May to July 2010 and is designed into six taught days of learning (three masterclasses of two days each). Masterclasses can be taken individually, or can be undertaken as an accredited module - 20 Credits at Level 3 or M.

Each masterclass is facilitated and taught by a range of healthcare professionals who are experts in their field.

Monday 10 and Tuesday 11 May 2010	An Overview of Head and Neck Cancer. Incidence, pathology and management. Oncological Management of Head and Neck Cancer.
Monday 14 and Tuesday 15 June 2010	The Surgical Management of Head and Neck Cancers. Post-operative care, wound and airway management.
Monday 12 and Tuesday 13 July 2010	Beyond Treatment. Issues in survivorship and the management of advanced head and neck cancer.

The cost for each masterclass is £250 and takes place at the Glenside Campus, University of the West of England.
